HOUSTON, TX (May 12, 2014) – Good Taste is a group exhibition consisting of works on paper, mixed media, sculpture, and photographs. The exhibition includes a diverse group of eight artists: Peter Anton, Donald Baechler, Christopher Boffoli, Jeffrey Dell, Philip Durst, Lisa Ludwig, Fernando Mastrangelo, and Mark Menjivar. Food is incorporated into each work featured in the exhibition, whether it be the backdrop, the subject matter, or the media.

Christopher Boffoli's works feature miniature toy figurines in a food world. As a subtle reference to society's consumption of large portions, food acts as the backdrop or setting in these photographs and provides rich color and texture. Seemingly gigantic, food dominates Boffoli's images, with toy figurines cleverly placed in the scene.

Peter Anton creates actual larger-than-life sculptures of chocolates, doughnuts and other sweets. Hyperrealistic, his rich and mouthwatering sculptures are meant to lure in the viewer, stimulating pleasure and cravings. Jeffrey Dell also creates works featuring desserts that relate to the theme of indulgence. From the series *Follies*, these works comment on temptation and consumption. Pulsating forms and hue shifts highlight the illusive nature of the desserts. These visual oscillations bring up questions of self-control.

Lisa Ludwig and Fernando Mastrangelo are two artists in the exhibition that use food as their media. Lisa Ludwig's cake sculptures are meticulously crafted out of sugar and mixed materials. Fernando Mastrangelo uses sugar, salt, and sprinkles in his works, elevating the materials to create stunning medallions reminiscent of Aztec ornaments.
